Boys and Girls Club: Mary Budke and Steve Deuterman

- It takes \$1.5M each year for operating costs, such as meals, art, drama
- There are 100 kids on waitlist in Port Angeles – the building is just too small. Capital Campaign in progress to raise funds for new clubhouse. These kids are from all income levels, and B&GC provides free meals throughout the year.
- Free lunches provided:
 - 2016: 20,246
 - 2017: 23,919
 - 2018: 25,570
- OPHCC provided sweatshirts and fun packs for Summer Lunch Program, and lunches included produce from the gleaning program.
