

**Olympic Peninsula Healthy Community Coalition
Partner Meeting
June 20, 2018**

The meeting opened at 1:08 p.m. at the Skills Center in Port Angeles with a welcome by Andra Smith (because Mark was running late)

Partner Update

- **First Teacher** – Nicole Brewer reported that they were now adding outdoor activities at the play area at 3rd and Alder in Sequim
- **PA School District** – Cindy Kelly reported that they are looking to do more outreach to bring awareness to the school-based health center so more students know about the program and its availabilities
- **Sequim School District** – Jim Stoffer reported they are beginning the rehab kitchen project and working to ensure it will be ready when school starts. Also Summer Lunch sites will be held at Greywolf Elementary and the high school during summer school classes at those campuses
- **Sequim School District** – Terry Barrett reported they will be holding informal youth activities this summer about every three weeks
- **OMC** – Donna Pacheco reported that they were holding a mini Wellness Fair featuring the 5210 Leadership Challenge and asking employees to accept the challenge too
- **United Way** – Hailey Pearce resource manager, reported that this is her first meeting and she is very excited to be here and be part
- **Panacea Spa** – Julia Anderson, owner, first time here and very excited to be here. They work closely with PBH and moving towards food as your medicine.
- **WSU Extension** – Reports from several partners
 - Sequim Farmers Market Senior produce vouchers are available through OlyCAP. The vouchers can be redeemed at participating farmers markets and may have matching funds available.
 - Gleaning season is getting underway. At least half of what is gleaned goes to help feed others. They are hoping to expand gleaning in Forks. A Summer Vista has been hired to help expand gleaning to the West End. A research associate is on board this summer to collect data on gleaning and research commodities in Clallam County
- **Clallam EDC** – Debbie Swanson reported that they are working with WSU Extension to find ways to use the Skills Center kitchen for the community. They are also working on a Port Angeles Housing assessment. Pennies for Quarters has property under contract.
- **Lower Elwha Health Clinic** – Jody Potter and Marissa reported they are working on getting the garden back up. They are holding meals and events with elders and Head Start on nutrition and healthy traditional foods preparation
- **Clallam County** – Mark Ozias reported that Dr. Frank is leaving and will begin the process of looking for a new Public Health Officer.

- **Sequim Free Clinic** – Patty Lebowitz and Sara Nicholls reported on their Get Growing gardening program (finally seeing success), their Working on Wellness program (hugely successful), announced their Fun Walk will be held September 8 in Sequim. They received a grant from Walgreens to provide immunizations free beginning this fall
- **B&G Club** – Mary Budke reported they are using 5210 at both clubs and lunch sites. This summer there are six sites in PA and five in Sequim

- Mark Ozias gave the president's report since Monica was not here. He reported that the board continues to work to advance all our efforts of the organization

Old Business

- **5210 Leadership Challenge** – Insert came out in the paper this week regarding challenge. Kickoff is set for June 28. Please help pass the word and support the leaders by accepting the challenge too
- **B&G Summer Lunch 5210 Challenge Project** – Fridays at the summer lunch sites will be Fun Friday. Thank you to Walmart for providing fun activity games to be used. Volunteers will be available to play games and have activities at each of the summer lunch sites in Sequim and Port Angeles
- **Back to School Fairs** – Booth applications are being taken at this time. The dates of the fairs are August 18 in Port Angeles and August 25 in Sequim
- **Website Update** – The OPHCC website is being updated, content and graphics are being added. Please send Leslee your organization events and updates to be added to website. Also please send your logo to Leslee so they can be added to partner list on website

New Business

- **First Federal Sequim** - A request was made and accepted by First Federal for the purchase of a smoothie bike. We will now have our own smoothie bike.
- **Group Health Grant** – OPHCC received a grant for \$7,500 to submit a video or report that explains our coalition, how we began, what we accomplished, and how we accomplished what we have. A video was submitted.
- **Phillips Fund Grant Request** – a grant was submitted to Phillips requesting \$33,000 for expansions of 5210 in schools, establishing a GRuB program in Sequim, and help expand Kids at Hope
- **Elementary Classroom Training** – OPHCC was asked to give a presentation on 5210. We set up a sugary drink display and helped elementary students at Roosevelt Elementary in Port Angeles learn how to calculate how much sugar is in drinks. This was the first time in the PA schools and was a success. We have been asked to work with other staff to repeat/expand the discussion in the future and at more schools in the district

- **Sequim Field Days** – Again, successful events at Helen Haller and Greywolf field days
- **5210 Clallam County Jail** – Mark Ozias spoke with administration from the Clallam County Jail. They are interested in 5210 training and integrating it into the jail. More to come on this topic.
