President's Report: Monica

- Monica is stepping down as president of the board.

 - Karlena has been with WSU extension doing food access & security work for last 3 years. She will be primarily responsible for outreach to Medicaid recipients

- OPHCC received \$25,000 for last two years' work. \$25,000 more will be coming in February for 2019, then \$25,000 each year thru 2023

OPCC: Shenna

- 3200 visits in 2017; 2/3 were uncompensated care
- Their mission is to
 - Fill the gap
 - Take services on the road

- Lessons learned from the Community Shelter Challenge
 - Public restrooms are needed
 - Transportation barriers
 - Shelters are not always a great option for everyone
 - 40% Sequim homeless are women between 60 & 80 yrs.
 - 44% in county are families with children
 - We need fact based conversations
- Emily (ED PA food bank) said that their bathroom is available. People have been respectful. This is a 3 month trial.

Peninsula Behavioral Health: Rebekah

- 5210 is currently rolling out in the Medical Department at Peninsula Behavioral Health. It's becoming a part of charting. Donna Pacheco put together amazing prescription pads and posters

Sequim Food Bank: Andra

- Sequim School District kids need more snacks. Andra established a contact at each campus, & the food bank is delivering snacks to that person for distribution, but it will become a funding issue
- Jennifer said there's an RFP for company to provide food. She added that House Bill 2610 will require free & reduced lunch form for all students
- Sequim's lunch debt is now \$12,000; working on how to eliminate

PA School District: Cindy

- Last Contract in PA was supposed to include local food, but it didn't work
- Wellness Committee formed. Invited Emily (PA Food Bank) to come to next meeting.
- Wants school nurse to know about 5210
- PA has \$50K in lunch debt.
